A Message From the Pastor

Aloha Harris Ohana,

This year, Advent begins with disturbing news bombarding us every day. You may be like me, in that I want to be informed, I want to know what is happening around the world, but I don't want to give all the violence and news of war so much attention that I become depressed or hopeless.



To counter all the bad news, the Worship Committee has selected "Journey in Hope" as our Advent Theme, with the words Hope, Peace, Joy and Love for the candles on the Advent Wreath.

As people of faith, who believe in the message of Jesus who preached God's grace, healing power, forgiveness and love, we have the opportunity to focus on these things during Advent. To give up, to give in to depression or hopelessness, is to deny our faith and let the negative, violent energy take over. To help us focus on the Good News of the birth of Jesus, the California Pacific Conference staff has prepared an Advent Calendar, included in the Nu'u News. You will notice that each week, the focus is the same word that we are using for our Advent Wreath -- we chose them from this calendar. Then there are suggestions each day on how we might live out the promise of Advent. There are probably too many suggestions for us to do them all, but there may be one or two each week that will be something that inspires us and that we can do to lift our spirits and help us keep our focus on Advent.

I also have been reminded of the healing that can come from focusing on our breath -the Spirit of God (spiritus, from the Latin word for breath) that breathes life into us with each of the 23,000 breaths we take each day. One suggestion is that as we focus on our breath, we breathe in the presence of the sacred, and ex-press (breath out, voice) our gratitude. This, then, can become a breath prayer that sustains us throughout the day.

As we practice our faith with the suggestions on the Advent Calendar and perhaps practice a breath prayer, we also remember that God's wisdom is the light of the world, and the darkness will not overcome it.

May we all be strong in our faith as we Journey in Hope during Advent this December.
