### A Message From the Pastor

Aloha Harris UMC Ohana,

As we prepare to celebrate and recognize our Graduates on June 9, I am aware of how important education is for everyone. At Harris UMC, the Spiritual Formation Ministry is the committee that oversees all the educational activities and events at the church. These range from fellowship and fun activities, to learning to play the Ukulele, to Bible study groups and Sunday School for all ages. The history of Sunday



School is a regular school that would teach English to those whose first language was not English on Sunday morning, to help them navigate a new culture in a new, unfamiliar language, for getting a job and being successful in a new place, and often a new country. In addition to English and other basic education, Bible study was included, since, after all, we were -- and are -- a church.

What a great opportunity this is to remember that we can be life-long learners. There is so much new information about almost everything that it can be overwhelming, but we also have many ways of learning about the world, our selves, our work, and the church and our faith. I remember when I first learned about anthropomorphism -- a long word that simply means we see God through our own human experience and eyes, giving God attributes that we see around us in our own lives. As United Methodists, we are encouraged to ask questions about our own experience of God -- God as creator, God as spirit and comforter, God as redeemer -- and what that means for us. At the core is our faith, our understanding of God as the One Source who is unconditional love and acceptance, creator of all we know. And then we use our reason, our knowledge of Biblical scholarship to explore our experience God and God's grace in our own time and context.

Church and faith is an exciting, inspiring experience when we are curious about how God is leading us and guiding us at the center of our lives. It is exciting to be life-long learners on our faith journey. As we celebrate our graduates at the ending of one phase of their education, and starting a new beginning as they go on for another level of education or for work, I encourage all of us to also celebrate our faith journeys, and how we continually learn and grow as people of faith.



### **Meet the Harris UMC Organist**

### Kaori Kawabuchi

In past years, newsletter articles have focused on learning more about our Harris staff. Since that time we've welcomed two new people to our ohana. This issue of Nuu News



interviews features Kaori Kawabuchi, church organist/pianist, Our July issue will highlight Rev. Fran Wiebenga as she begins her second year of appointment to Harris.

Kaori's name has a beautiful meaning in Japanese Kanji....sing and harmony! How appropriate for our pianist/organist! She relates that she inherited her mother's love for music - "it brings us a lot of joy and fulfillment."

A native of Kawasaki City, Japan, Kaori's mother enrolled her in the renowned Yamaha Piano school from the age of 3! She continued to study piano and pipe organ in college. To pursue her passion for music she took a leap of faith and moved to various locations worldwide: Maui, Sydney, New York and finally Oahu, leaving behind her parents and younger brother who still live in Japan. Her work experience is extensive! She has been a wedding pianist, school teacher, director of choirs, played Gospel music, and keyboard for some well known bands, has entertained on cruise ships and performed as a lounge artist. Her career in Hawaii reached

a highlight when she was nominated for the prestigious Na Hoku Hanohano Award as a favorite entertainer. Her Christmas album was named the best of the year! It was a true turning point in her musical career.

When asked about how she came to Harris UMC, Kaori described looking for a church in town, since she doesn't drive and wanted a place closer to Kakaako where she and her son, Orion, lives. She saw an online advertisement from Aiea UMC and contacted Pastor Sam who referred her to Harris Initially, she served as our substitute organist but when the vacancy occurred in March of 2023, she was interviewed and hired as our staff organist in April.

Kaori's free time is spent near the ocean, watching the sunsets, getting together with her son and her friends for a soulful kanikapila session. Her favorite place to vacation is Thailand and she is looking forward to visiting the Pacific countries of Samoa, Tonga and Tahiti in the near future.


