### Rev. Dr. Frances Wiebenga

Here are some interesting facts about our current interim pastor that may surprise and delight you!

Frances Marie
Wiebenga was
named for her
grandmother and
has Dutch ancestry
on both her parents'
sides. Born in the
midwest (Michigan),
she spent most of



her childhood in Venice, Florida. The midwest called her back and she attended Hope College in Holland, MI where she majored in music. Continuing her education, Fran enrolled in Southern Methodist University where she obtained a master's degree in music and spent time as a music and piano teacher. At SMU she became interested in theater and dance and was a choreographer and actor!

Seattle, WA was her next stop where she discovered the United Methodist Church and her call to ministry. She is a graduate of Claremont School of Theology, where she obtained both a Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry degrees. The California-Pacific Annual Conference has been her home since then. Rev. Fran has served churches in South Central LA, West Los Angeles, and Santa Maria, CA. before being appointed to Hilo and Wahiawa UMC.

In her free time Fran likes to swim, play the guitar and piano. Her travels have taken her to hike the Grand Canyon, and camp in Yosemite and Redwoods National Parks. Fran and Walter enjoyed trips to India, Kenya, Ireland and Machu Picchu. She enjoys art museums and the Getty Museum, north of LA, is one of her favorites. Fran was asked, "What motivated you to come out of retirement and take the interim position as pastor at Harris?" Here is her response......



"Many of you knew my husband, Walter Killough, who was a member of Harris UMC when he lived in Honolulu. We got married in 2008 and he passed away in August 2022. I gave myself a year to mourn, and I appreciate the help of grief support groups and counselors during that time.

Toward the end of that year I began to be ready to think beyond that time of mourning, and had just wondered what I would like to do when I received a call from DS Lee about coming to Harris UMC. God really does work in mysterious and wonderful ways, and I give thanks that God knew that to complete the

healing of my loss of Walter I needed to be in the church, with other people of faith. So, after a short time of prayer and discernment, I said 'yes.' I am truly grateful to be here at Harris UMC as your interim pastor."

Here is her answer when asked to share facts that would surprise us... After she retired in 2014, Rev. Fran practiced yoga and has a 500 hour Yoga teaching credential. Her nearby yoga studio closed because of the pandemic, or she might be a yoga teacher today! In addition, Rev. Fran has practiced Contemplative Prayer for many years and actually enjoys reading and studying Theology!

And finally, this interviewer had to ask...You seem so organized and aware of deadlines what's your time management secret? Years ago Fran was able to go to a day-long "planner school" when the Franklin planner was at its most popular. Tips are to use one planner (although she uses one for worship/ Sunday planning and has one for everything else). Set short term and long term goals and review them frequently and see the preparation that needs to be done for what is coming up. She is really aware that if she doesn't fulfill her own goals and what needs to be done for the ministry of the church, it impacts the staff and their time, and the congregation and our worship experience.

"Even more important, I think it is part of our

spiritual experience to be mindful of how our lives intertwine and interact, and I want to bring the best experience possible for all of us together, in all that I do."

## Experiencing the 2024 California-Pacific Annual Conference

As elected delegates from Harris to the Cal-Pac annual conference there was work to be done before our June travels to LA!

- Attendance at the District conference meeting May 11 from 1-3 pm
- 2. Reading the 82 page Preliminary Report received one week prior to the annual conference. The Report contained 28 reports from conference committees and 6 recommendations, 11 resolutions and 3 rule changes to be voted upon during the Plenary sessions.
- 3. Two days prior to our departure we attended the District pre-conference briefing from 3 -4:45 pm.

On June 12 at the registration table we received an additional 9 page participant guide.

### **Updates/Upcoming**

The theme of the conference was Flourish - a word designed to encourage us to do well and bloom in our own lives, in the community we are serving, and in our churches. Bishop Dottie Escobedo-Frank urged us to go deep with the people that surround us and flourish with the people we notice, those we don't, and the ones who are invisible, and those who are suffering.

A barefoot Bishop Dottie delivered her open, welcoming message by urging us to set our churches free from the shackles/bonds that constrain us. End spiritual hunger by 1) building relationships with people, 2) tell the stories of Jesus, 3) work on making our spaces/places of warmth and love. Ask the possibilities of ..... "what if?"

Another highlight featured the Acts of Repentance video, and presenters Rev. Amy Wake from Trinity UMC and native Hawaiian, Colette Anderson from Waianae UMC. In addition, a special conference offering was taken for Susannah Wesley Community Center in the heart of Kalihi.

On the schedule for the 1,000+ attendees were 6 worship services and 6 plenary sessions. Efforts at improving communication were evident with screens displaying translations in English, Spanish and Korean. For a few of the sessions, American Sign Language interpreters were available. Each lunch or dinner had a special focus and celebration. Natividad (Naty) Lagaso from Aldersgate UMC received the Bishop's award for her devotion and service to the conference.

The Board of Ordained Ministry welcomed back one person whose orders were surrendered many years ago, but who is now entitled to have them back under the General Conference's decision this year to reinstate those who had their orders removed or surrendered them due to their sexual

orientation, gender identity, or for celebrating a same gender wedding or union.

We also welcomed one person transferring under our new Safe Sanctuary policy, which expedites the transfer process for those who are transferring to our conference due to incompatibility in their conference or denomination with their own sexual orientation, gender identity or stance on same sex weddings. The 2024 Conference culminated with the commissioning and ordination of new deacons and elders

This was the second year no Conference budget was presented but was delayed until the special session in October. Hawaii again was the highest district in the conference in paying apportionments for 2023. Our district has always paid 100% or close to 100% ever since we became a district in 1967!
