A Message From the Pastor

Aloha Friends.

I seldom cry anymore, I write "anymore" because there have been times in my life that were very difficult, when I wept tears of regret, frustration and sorrow, often night after night. Yes, we all have times that are described as "The Dark Night of the Soul." It was after one night of weeping those tears that I was totally emptied out of the deep emotion that caused the tears, that I sat down and simply breathed into a meditation — and something happened. I cannot describe it other than I knew, I simply knew, that God was with me. I felt the Presence of the Source that we call God. I also understood, in a new way, that God was there, with me. It was a new and different knowing. More complete. I was at peace. It changed my life. I trusted in the Presence of our loving God in a new way. And I continue to trust.

Which is why I was surprised to find a single tear slipping from the corner of my left eye, sliding down my left cheek, after reading about some of what is happening in the political life of our country. And, I have awakened more than one morning with a similar tear emerging as I opened my eyes, for we are in a dark valley of intentional cruelty that impacts all of us.

I don't know if Jesus had a tear slide down his cheek as he cried out for the city of Jerusalem, that he longed to gather her to himself as a hen gathers her chicks. We are told that Jesus wept for his friend Lazarus. At this time, it is important to remember that Jesus did not leave Lazarus in the tomb, where he had been placed. He prayed. He prayed with all his might. Then Jesus called to Lazarus to come out. And Lazarus was given new life. (John 11:1-44)

Our Lenten theme is "Through the valley of the shadow into the light." God does not leave us feeling hopeless and dead. We may weep as we go through this valley of the shadow, but God is with us. God is present, calling us to go through the valley with the One who made us. We are called to walk together, in trust, until we come into the light. The promise is that the light is always there, for God is always with us. God does not give up on us, and it is only if we give up on God that we are truly lost.

So, during this Lenten time of reflection, we might want to engage with some of the tried-and-true devotional practices of prayer and meditation as we go through the valley. We can use our Upper Room and other devotional guides, other books, periodicals such as Sojourners (which has some practical suggestions of what we might do), books and blogs (I recommend "The Cottage" by Diana Butler Bass). And as we walk together through the valley of the shadow, I trust that we will continue into the light to receive the blessing of hope and new vision.




