Easter Sunday, Apr. 20th @ 10:45 am-Service followed by Egg Hunt and Potluck Lunch in Miyama Hall.





A Message From the Pastor

Aloha Friends,

We are at the end of our Lenten journey, "Through the Valley of the Shadow into the Light" with just two weeks until Palm Sunday on April 13, Holy Week — with the remembrance of Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples and followers on Thursday night April 17, and then the betrayal, trial, and crucifixion on Good Friday April 18. Finally, we arrive at a new day on Easter. We will have gone through seven weeks of introspection, journeying through the darkness and shadow, arriving with the light of dawn on Easter morning.

Although we travel this liturgical journey from beginning to end starting on Ash Wednesday, going through the deepest valley to the light of Easter morning, we know that life is not a linear journey but a circular, or cyclical, experience of valleys and times of light.

One way to experience this journey is with a walking meditation, on a path that we call the Labyrinth. It is a circular path that is a metaphor for our spiritual journey of darkness and light, of times when we feel God present, near to us, and the times when we do not. When we walk the Labyrinth, we begin on the edge and it looks like there will be a straight path to the center. which is a metaphor for Christ at the center of our lives. But that is not to be. Instead, the path will wind around. It will take us close to the center, and then all of a sudden we are again at the edge of the path, taking us far from the center, but still on the path. Then, as we keep walking, just when it seems that we will forever be far from the center and God's presence, the path takes a surprise loop and we find ourselves in the center, in the presence of our gracious God. We may stay as long as we like in the center. It is like a mountain top experience. But then, we retrace our steps and, with a new awareness of what our journey with Jesus might be like, go into the world once again.

We will have the opportunity to walk the Labyrinth on Good Friday, before and after the worship service. The Methodist Youth Fellowship will set it up, and it will be ready by 10am. You may walk it more than once, for our journey with God is ongoing. It can be a slow meditative experience, or a joyful experience when it feels more like moving quickly, even dancing, through the path.

And a word about Easter: Why does Easter come early some years, and later in the year other times? The date of Easter was set in 325CE by the Council of Nicaea, and is truly about light — the light of the stars, and the movement of the heavenly bodies. It is the first Sunday, after the first full moon after the vernal equinox. "Even if calculated on the basis of the Gregorian calendar, the date of the full moon sometimes differs from the astronomical first full moon after the March equinox." (Clarence E. Woodman, "Easter and the Ecclesiastical Calendar," Journal of the Royal Astronomical Society of Canada, 12 May 2019.)

This year, the vernal equinox was on March 20. The first full moon will be on April 12, just in time for Palm Sunday, and then Easter a week later.

As we journey through these last few days, "Through the Valley of the Shadow into the Light," let us do so with faith and anticipation of the hope and light of Easter.

Lenten Healing Journey with Rev. Fran Wiebenga





Rev. Lea M. Booth Has Been Appointed to Harris UMC




